Here are some of our stories for the month.

<u>MINISTRY OF MERCY ORPHANAGES</u>



The two locations of MoM Orphanages – Otutulu village and Lokoja received and cared for many orphans and vulnerable people in the month of December.

• New arrivals:

MoM Orphanages had these new arrivals in the month of December.

i. Ahmed Sherrif Isah was brought to Ministry of Mercy Orphanage Otutulu on December 4, 2021 for his care and upkeep following the death of his mother during childbirth on November 14, 2021. He will be reunited with his biological family after 2 years.



ii. On December 18, 2021, Ministry of Mercy Orphanage, Otutulu received Friday Isaiah Joel who was born on December 17, 2021. He was brought to the Orphanage for his care and upkeep following the death of his mother.



iii. On December 27, 2021, baby Bose Musa was brought to MoM orphanage, Lokoja for her care and upkeep following the death of her mother on December 13, 2021 as a result of complications from childbirth. It was agreed for the child to be reunited with her biological family after two years.



iv. Baby Miracle Abednigo who was born on December 28, 2021 was brought to Ministry of



Mercy Orphanage Otutulu on December 29, 2021 for his care and upkeep following the death of his mother during childbirth. It was agreed for him to be reunited with his biological family after one and half years.

• Official Handing Over:

During the course of last month, we handed over 12 of our children back to their biological families as they have reached the agreed duration of assistance signed at the time of their admission. Four of them are 18 years of age while the remaining eight are a little bit over 2 years. Please, pray that they will grow to know and accept Jesus as their personal Lord and savior even as they go to live with their unbelieving families.





• Uncle Monday Weds Francisca!

Mr. Monday Alidu (fondly called Uncle Monday or Big Uncle by the orphans) got married on the 17th of December 2021. He is a pioneer staff of the Lokoja branch of the Ministry of Mercy Orphanage, and has worked there tirelessly for several years. He did not join the organization as a staff, rather, he himself grew up in the orphanage from early childhood and now serves as the Lokoja branch coordinator. Little did he know he would meet the love of his life in this vine yard of the Lord.

Miss Francisca Shuaibu, on the other hand is a lovely beautiful Christian lady who is a community health extension worker. Divine providence brought her to Ministry of Mercy Medical Center where she has been working dutifully (interestingly, she was part of the team that delivered our first baby of 2022, just two weeks after her wedding. See cover photo). MoM Medical Center is located in the same premises with our Lokoja orphanage where Uncle Monday works as coordinator.



Long story made short, Uncle Monday woke up from his deep sleep of many years to find near him in the same premises, "the bone of his bones and the flesh of his flesh. She shall be called Mrs Francisca Alidu".

By the Grace of God, we were able to hold the wedding ceremony of our big Uncle and his dearly beloved wife Francisca on the 17th and 18th of December 2021. Many members

of the MoM family, both young and old were in attendance. Praying that the good Lord will build for them a home where he will rule and reign as king.

They both continue to work in Ministry of Mercy at Lokoja, where they previously lived as neighbors, but now together as a lovely couple.

MINISTRY OF MERCY FARMS

a. Poultry

i. Layers: there has been a drop in egg production lately and we are now picking an average of 6 crates from our poultry on daily basis which is being used in feeding our



children in the two homes- Otutulu and Lokoja. This has significantly improved our children's diet. ii. Our broilers were a major source of meat during the Chistmas celebration. We almost exhausted all that we had and are now planning on booking for a new set of 100.



b. Fish Pond:

We are already consuming the first set of 2000 fingerlings we got in August. It is being used in feeding our children in the two homes. This has greatly improved the nutritional need of our children. The last set we received are fast growing and would be ready for consumption before we exhaust the older ones.



c. <u>Crop Farm:</u> we were able to harvest our beans and are now processing in order for it to be used in feeding our children.

The month's update on our mission hospital is presented along the paths of the three main domains of the hospital's activities – General healthcare, Charity and the Gospel. We have the following few selected stories and relevant statistics from this arm:

CHARITY HEALTH SERVICES:


Several medical services were provided to many patients for free or at assisted cost during the month. Most of these services have to do with **maternal and child health cases**. **16** women had **child deliveries virtually free of charge** within the month, **five** of these was a **super-subsidized cesarean section**. This is in addition to **several orphans** who also had **medical services free of charge**. Few of these stories and statistics are summarized below.

Tosin Aishat DAVID

She is a 30 year old **MoMMC staff**, a mother of 2 in her 3rd pregnancy. Antenatal care was essentially uneventful. She had a premature rupture of membranes with fetal distress. Hence, she had a live female neonate through an emergency CS. Mother and baby are doing.



Oluwaseun FOLORUNJO, A mother of 2 in her 3rd pregnancy who presented at 32 weeks of gestation with Placenta previa (condition in which placenta covers the opening of the cervix



Deborah AFOLABI

A 31 year old with twin in her first pregnancy. Leading twin was in breech presentation. Had a live male and a female neonate via elective CS. Mother and babies are doing well.



Blessing NEHEMIAH

A 23 year old in her first pregnancy who presented with prolonged labor, maternal exhaustion and fetal distress. Findings during the emergency CS were obstructed labor and dead male fetus. Along with her husband she has been counseled to ensure proper ANC in next pregnancy. She is doing well.



Patience PROSPER, 25 year old mother of 1 who presented with excessive bleeding in her 2nd pregnancy. Abruptio placentae, dead male fetus and clots of blood were the findings in the Uterus during the emergency CS. She is doing well.

Azumi AGWAS, 20 year old in her first pregnancy who presented with prolonged labor. No formal antenatal care. Emergency CS findings were; obstructed labor and dead fetus. Along with her husband she has been counseled to ensure proper ANC in next pregnancy. She is doing well.
