MINISTRY OF MERCY ORPHANAGES



The two locations of MoM Orphanages – Otutulu village and Lokoja received and cared for many orphans and vulnerable people who joined our large family in the month of JULY.

New Arrivals:

MoM Orphanages had 5 new arrivals in the month of July.

i. MoM orphanage Otutulu received a newborn baby **Neziru Idris** on July 1, 2021.



The baby was brought to the orphanage for his care and upkeep following the death of his mother immediately after she was delivered on June 16, 2021. The boy who is an Afo by tribe hails from Nasarawa State. It was agreed for him to be reunited with his biological family after two years.

ii. Baby **Mary Seni** was born on June 30, 2021 and was brought to Ministry of Mercy Orphanage on July 5, 2021 for her care and upkeep following the death of her mother.

Mary hails from a Christian home in Benue State, please, pray that Mary may grow to accept Jesus as her Lord and personal Savior. She will be reunited with her biological family after 18 years.



iii. On July 10, 2021, baby Rebecca E. Matthew brought to MoM orphanage Otutulu for proper care and upbringing following the death of her mother shortly after her birth. The girl hails from a Christian family in Kogi State. She will be with the MoM family for her care and upbringing until she attains the age of 18. Please, pray that God may add more helping hands as our hands are packed full and babies are trooping in in their numbers.



iv. On the 18th of July, 2021, baby Deborah Joshua arrived Ministry of Mercy Orphanage Lokoja for her care and upkeep following the death of her mother on July 14, 2021 shortly after delivery. She hails from a Christian home in the



Federal Capital Territory. We know that the good Lord who preserved her life will make a wonder out of her. She will be reunited with her biological family after a period of two years.

MoM Orphanage Lokoja received yet another baby David Jonah in the month of V. July. The baby was diagnosed to have multiple congenital disabilities. he was



brought by his mother who was unable to afford the cost of keeping and caring for this kind of child. We arranged with the mother to stay back to take care of her son as we would pay her as a nanny. He hails from the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja. The mother would be around to take care of David until we are able to find a permanent caregiver for him.

During the month of July, two new staff joined the services of Ministry of Mercy Orphanage Lokoja.



while Mrs Rebecca Wabari joined MoM orphanage Lokoja as a nanny. Please pray for divine provision to keep meeting the ever increasing needs of our very large family.

MINISTRY OF MERCY FARMS

a. Poultry

Layers: we are now picking an average of 8 crates from our poultry on daily basis which is being used in feeding our children in the two homes- Otutulu and Lokoja. This has significantly improved our children's diet.



ii. Our set of 300 broilers is ready for consumption. We consume and average of 8 broilers in the two homes- Otutulu and Lokoja. In the month of July, we also



received another set of 200 broilers to ensure that we have another set ready for consumption just before the older ones gets finished.

• **Crop farm:** Our orphanage family in Otutulu have resorted to garri processing as a substitute for cassava flour which we would need enormous sunshine to process



since we now live in days of little or no sunshine. The nannies and the older children have been working tirelessly to ensure we have enough garri for the two homes.

We have almost exhausted our cassava in the farm and that would mean that we may start buying from the market anytime soon. We are preparing our farmlands for cassava as that is a major part of our nutrition.

The month's update on our mission hospital is presented along the paths of the three main domains of the hospital's activities – General healthcare, Charity and the Gospel. We have the following few selected stories and relevant statistics from this arm:

CHARITY HEALTH SERVICES:

Several medical services were provided to many patients for free or at assisted cost during the month. Most of these services have to do with **maternal and child health cases**. **16** women had **child deliveries free of charge** within the month, **9** of these were **free cesarean sections**. This is in addition to **several orphans** who also had **medical services free of charge**. Few of these stories are summarized below Here we have the following selected few stories and relevant statistics.



Esther RAPHAEL, 39 year old lady from Edo State, a mother of 2, presented in her 3rd pregnancy. She had uneventful antenatal period. However lie remained transverse. She therefore had an elective CS. Mother and baby are doing well.

Shabatu KABIRU, 18 year old Hausa lady from kaduna state in her first

Pregnancy, presented with prolonged labour. She had a baby boy via emergency CS. Mother and baby are doing well.





Ejura IDAKWO, a 28 year old Igala lady from Kogi state who presented in her 2nd pregnancy with a previous history of CS (no child alive), obesity and post datism. She had a baby boy via CS. Mother and baby are doing well.

Kate EGONG, 25 old from Cross River State, in her 2nd pregnancy presented with prolonged labour and a previous CS. She had a female neonate via emergency CS. Mother and child are doing well.




Priscilla USMAN, 28 year old lady from Anyigba, Kogi State, came in her 1st pregnancy with



Breech presentation, contracted pelvis and pelvic muscle atrophy. She had a baby boy via an elective CS. Mother and child are doing well.

Grace KAYODE, 32 year old, Yoruba lady, in her 4th pregnancy, presented with a suspected big baby and previous scar. She had a live male neonate via





Hannah ARUWA, Igala, 35 in her 3rd pregnancy had an uneventful ANC period. However her 2 previous deliveries were through CS. Therefore this 3rd pregnancy was via elective CS. She and her Male neonate are doing well.





Saidat ABUH, 24, an Igala lady from Kogi state, in her 2nd pregnancy, presented with Transverse/Breech at term and therefore had an emergency CS. Mother and baby are doing well.

Gift SOLOMON, 20 year old, Tiv lady from Benue state in her 2nd pregnancy went into labour at term after she was hit by stray bullets in the abdomen. She had a live female neonate with bullet wound at the right shoulder. The mother was brought to the hospital



on account of profuse bleeding. She was immediately taken in for emergency laparotomy. Findings in theatre were haemoperitoneum and piercings through the uterus from



bullets. These were repaired in a surgery that lasted over 4hours. She had massive transfusion. Mother and baby are doing well.

Jumoke ADELEGUN, 36 in her 5th pregnancy, was brought in unconscious with excessive bleeding at term. Emergency Laparotomy was commenced. Findings were placenta previa and IUFD (intrauterine fetal death). Subtotal hysterectomy was done. She is doing well.

Here we have the following selected few stories and relevant statistics.

Omolabake SUNDAY, 38 in her 4th pregnancy, presented with severe anaemia, abdominal distention and fainting attack. She was evaluated to have a ruptured ectopic pregnancy with haemoperitoneum. It was drama in the operation theatre as the floor was covered with blood. She had massive blood transfusion. At the end it was worth the troubles as the patient walked out of the facility healthy after 11 days.

The family remained grateful to the facility and declaring that God indeed works through men.

Paul SAMSON, 16 year old boy, presented with fever, abdominal pain and



vomiting. He visited a peripheral hospital before presenting at MoMMC.

Ultrasound studies suggested Intestinal Obstruction from typhoid perforation.

An exploration of the abdomen revealed Typhoid perforation with Peritonitis.

The damaged bowels were resected. Patient is still in the ward and hopes are high that he will make it.
