## Case in Point



We'd like to introduce you to **Delcy**. Delcy is a Colombian missionary doing Bible translation for the Katio people of Colombia, carrying on work started by a Wycliffe missionary. She is doing a fabulous job! Delcy received her training at CILTA, the missionary training school in Peru where Robert taught in 2015. In order to take this training, Delcy had to travel to Peru and pay for tuition, room and board. It was excellent but very expensive.

Meet her co-worker **Claudia**, also a Colombian missionary. She helps Delcy with literacy and audiovisuals among the Katios. She also works as a civil engineer for a mining company to help fund their missionary work because the financial support they receive is minimal. (It can be very hard to raise support in third world countries. Even with her sala-

ry, they need more income.) Claudia did not go to CILTA. But she is interested in taking some of Robert's courses down the road to improve her skills for the ministry. She will not have to travel anywhere to take Robert's courses. She will be able to do it online right at home at little or no cost to herself, fitting them into her schedule as she is able. This is the dream Robert has had. To be able to offer courses to third world missionaries wherever they are, at little or no cost to them. To be clear, Robert's repertoire of courses will not overlap with CILTA's. But he desires that third world missionaries be able to get valuable training right where they are to help them be successful in their ministries.



He has more ideas for courses to write than he could complete in a lifetime. He currently has about 30 courses in various stages of development.



**Fun facts:** Delcy was in the first graduating class of CILTA, and was also the first missionary sent out by a church that Robert's dad pastored in Colombia in its early days more than 70 years ago!
