Week 24 was another week of successfully ushering more babies unto life on earth. Here are a few highlights from the week.

On Sunday, a 30 year old mother of 4 was finally delivered of her 5th baby – a live baby boy after an uneventful labor. Birth weight is 3.2kg. It was a great relief for her after experiencing 2 weeks of intermittent false labor (having to be asked to return home each time she came to the hospital during those 2 weeks of false labor). The family is grateful.

On Wednesday, a 31 year old in her second pregnancy had a straight-forward delivery of a 3.1kg baby girl. But just before she was moved out of the delivery room, significant postpartum bleeding ensued. Appropriate measures arrested this bleeding. Bleeding after childbirth is the most common cause of maternal deaths in Nigeria according to epidemiological statistics. Thank God for his deliverance.

On Thursday, a 28 year old brought forth her 3.2kg baby girl via a straight- forward labor process. Mother and child are fine.
