## MINISTRY OF MERCY ORPHANAGES



The two locations of MoM Orphanages - Otutulu village and Lokoja received and cared for many orphans and vulnerable people in the months of November.

## - New arrivals:

MoM Orphanages had 5 new arrivals in the month of November.
i. Baby Mercy Benjamin was brought to Ministry of Mercy Orphanage Otutulu on


November 5, 2021 for her care and upkeep following the death of her mother during childbirth on November 4, 2021.
She will be reunited with her biological family after 18 years.
ii. On November 15, 2021, Ministry of Mercy Orphanage, Otutulu received a set of twin babies Success Ojodomo Anthony and Wisdom Ojoanache
 Anthony who were born on July 31, 2021. They were brought to the Orphanage for their care and upkeep following the death of their mother. We need prayers for more aunties that will help in taking care of the ever increasing number of our babies.
iii. On November 6, 2021, baby Ukpowokiga Danladi was brought to MoM orphanage, Otutulu for his care and upkeep following the death of his mother on November 4,
 2021 as a result of complications from childbirth. It was agreed for the child to be reunited with their biological family after two years.
iv. Baby Famous Sediq who was born on November 29, 2021 was brought to Ministry of Mercy Orphanage Otutulu on
 November 30, 2021 for his care and upkeep following the death of his mother during childbirth. It was agreed for him to be reunited with his biological family after 18 years.


## A. Poultry

i. Layers: there has been a drop in egg production lately and we are now picking an average of 6 crates from our poultry on daily basis which is being used in feeding our children in the two homes- Otutulu and Lokoja. This significantly contributes to the improvement our children's diet.

ii. Our broilers are now ready for consumption. We consume an average of 8 broilers on daily basis. Thank God for his provision.

B. Fish pond: The first set of 2000 fingerlings we got in August is now ready for consumption. It is being used in feeding our children in the two homes. This has greatly improved the nutritional need of our children.

The month's update on our mission hospital is presented along the paths of the three main domains of the hospital's activities - General healthcare, Charity and the Gospel. We have the following few selected stories and relevant statistics from this arm:

## CHARITY HEALTH SERVICES:

Several medical services were provided to many patients for free or at assisted cost during the month. Most of these services have to do with maternal and child health cases. 14 women had child deliveries virtually free of charge within the month, one of these was a super-subsidized cesarean section. This is in addition to several orphans who also had medical services free of charge. Few of these stories and statistics are summarized below.

Aisha MOHAMMED, a 32 year old mother of 3 who presented in her $4^{\text {th }}$ pregnancy with vaginal bleeding. An emergency CS was done. Findings were: anaemia, severe hypertension, ruptured uterus and dead female fetus. Uterus was repaired
 and bilateral tubal ligation was done. Anemia was corrected and blood pressure was controlled. She did well and was discharged.

Omowunmi ADEDOYIN, a 40 year old mother of 1 who came in her $2^{\text {nd }}$ pregnancy with prolonged obstructed labor. Had an emergency CS. Findings were: dead male fetus, obstructed labor and partial uterine rupture. She is doing well.


## Zuwaira MUHAMMED,

She is a 30 year old civil servant, and mother of 2 from 3 pregnancies. She presented with an upper thigh swelling of 1 year duration. The swelling which thought to be Rhabdomyosarcoma (a soft tissue cancer) was removed and sent for histology. She is to be reviewed with result later.

Elaigwu IBRAHIM, 27 years old young man with bilateral Plantar corn, a condition characterized by generalized
 hyperkeratosis (excessive thickening and folding) of soles of the feet. He had a wide excision and skin graft of the right foot last month. After a good healing. Same procedure was done for the left foot. He is in the ward recuperating.

## Nasiratu UMARO,



A 7-year-old girl with an exposed sequestrated left Tibia. She was operated by a team led by the orthopedic surgeon. The surgical operation was removal of dead bone, corticotomy of the tibia and application of llizarov (an external fixator) for bone transport. She is in the word for daily manipulation.
