MINISTR OF MERCY ORPHANAGES



New Admissions:

We had a total of 8 new arrivals (7 in MoM Otutulu and 1 in MoM Lokoja) for the month of December 2022. Six of them are newborns while the other two were some months old before they were brought.

> These set of twin babies, Nana - Aisha Musa (twin1) and Munira Musa (twin2) arrived MoM Otutulu December 03, 2022.



MINISTRY OF MERCY MEDICAL CENTER



The month's update on our mission hospital is presented along the paths of the three main domains of the hospital's activities – General healthcare, Charity and the Gospel. We have the following few selected stories and relevant statistics from this arm:

CHARITY HEALTH SERVICES:

Several medical services were provided to many patients for free or at assisted cost during the month. Most of these services have to do with **maternal and child health cases**. **Eight** women had **child deliveries virtually free of charge** within the month; **two** of these were **highly-**

subsidized cesarean sections. This is in addition to **several orphans** who also had **medical services free of charge**. A few of these stories and statistics are summarized below.

Rachael Temitope ADEYEMO, 34-year-old in her first pregnancy. The presentation was breech coexisting with a huge Fibroid. She had an elective C-Section with excision of a huge pedunculated Fibroid during which a live Male neonate weighing 2.6 kg was extracted. Mother and child are doing well.



Rebecca IBITAYO, a 32-year-old mother of 2 from 2 previous C-sections. She, therefore, had an elective C-Section. The mother and her male neonate are doing well.



Joy AMEH, is a 30-year-old lady in her first pregnancy. Said to have had Ante Natal Care at a peripheral Centre but presented with prolonged labor. After review, she was diagnosed with Obstructed labor with fetal distress. An emergency C-Section brought out a severely asphyxiated baby which survived against all odds. Mother and baby are doing well.



Ejima ABDULKARIM, 28 years old mother of 2 presented with excessive vaginal bleeding and inability to feel fetal movement in her 3rd pregnancy. She had emergency surgery which revealed a perforated uterus with a dead macerated baby floating in the peritoneum. The uterus was repaired in a rather prolonged surgery. Thereafter she had 5 pints of blood transfused. Fortunately, she did well and was discharged after a week of hospital stay. There was no complaint at her follow-up review 2 weeks later.

Melody JUDE is a 6-year-old boy with a huge scrotal swelling. Was diagnosed with Hydrocele. He had a successful Hydrocelectomy. He is doing well.



Michelle EMMANUEL is a 3-year-old daughter of the hospital Admin officer who presented with features of bilateral inguinal hernia. She had a successful herniotomy and transfixation of the sacs. She is doing well.

• REPORT FROM MoM Clinic Outlet in Otutulu Village:

a. One of the newly arrived children in the month of December, Kebiru Alibesiru was diagnosed with a neonatal infection of the umbilical stump by one of our volunteer medical officers who also prescribed drugs treatments for him. Then the health workers at MOM Orphanage Otutulu administered the treatments. The baby has recovered.



b. One of our mothers and a senior nanny at MOM Orphanage Otutulu, was on admission at MOMMC Lokoja for about 8 months during which she went through surgical procedures two consecutive times. She was discharged home and has since been regaining her health and strength.




• A lot of our children suffered from diarrhea in the month of December, but we thank God they are now recovered.
