### MINISTRY OF MERCY ORPHANAGES



#### New Admissions:

We received three new orphans into our Orphanage in Otutulu in the month of October 2022.

1. **Shaibu Ismaila,** was born on 29 September, 2022. He was brought to Ministry of Mercy Orphanage, Otutulu on 03, Oct. 2022, following the death of his mother as a result of excessive bleeding during and after birth. He hails from Tondo, Toto LGA, Nasarawa State. The father's name is Ismaila Jibrin and the mother's name is Hassana Shaibu.



2. **Mercy Joseph** was brought to the Ministry of Mercy Otutulu on October 29, 2022, after the death of her mother which happened on 20 October, 2022, resulting from a snake bite. Mercy was born on June 20, 2022 and was breastfed for four months before her mother died. She hailed from Icheke-Ogane, Omala LGA, Kogi State. Her father's name is Joseph Ikoja and the mother's name was Ema Joseph Nee Baba.



3. **Daniel Samuel** is a motherless child, brought to MoM Otutulu from Udege Dev. Area, Kuvo LGA, Nasarawa State on October 29, 2022 following the death of his mother, caused by bleeding after childbirth. He was born on October 26, 2022 the father's name is Samuel Ogaji while the mother's name is Okowuna Samuel Nee Dansebe.



#### **NEW EMPLOYMENT AND RESIGNATION:**

1. MoM Orphanage, Lokoja had a boost in staff members especially with security department, having employed **four new security men** to improve her security achitecture. From the left they are, Mr. David Usman Enemi, Mr. Mabe Adama, Mr. ThankGod Ibrahim and Mr. Samuel Moses.




#### REPORT FROM THE FARM.

### MINISTRY OF MERCY MEDICAL CENTER



The month's update on our mission hospital is presented along the paths of the three main domains of the hospital's activities – General healthcare, Charity and the Gospel. We have the following few selected stories and relevant statistics from this arm:

#### **CHARITY HEALTH SERVICES:**

Several medical services were provided to many patients for free or at assisted cost during the month. Most of these services have to do with **maternal and child health cases**. 13 women had **child deliveries virtually free of charge** within the month; **three** of these was a **highly-subsidized cesarean section**. This is in addition to **several orphans** who also had **medical services free of charge**. Few of these stories and statistics are summarized below.

**Obiye MAHA**, a 25-year-old lady who presented excessive vaginal bleeding in her first pregnancy. She had an emergency C-Section during which a live female neonate was extracted. Mother and child doing well.



**Memunat O. MUSA**, a 23-year-old lady in her 2nd pregnancy. She has history of previous C-SECTION on account of a suspected big baby and short stature. She had a successful C-section during which a live male neonate was extracted. Mother and baby doing well.





**Abimbola AREWA**, a 36-year-old mother of 2 in her 3rd pregnancy. She presented with prolonged labour and inability to feel baby movement. Diagnosis of obstructed labour and intrauterine fetal death was made after due examination. A C-section was done during which a macerated dead male neonate was extracted. Mother is fine and doing well.



**Eucharia MATTHEW**, a 23-year-old in her 3rd pregnancy, who presented with prolonged obstructed labour. The severely asphyxiated baby didn't make it. She had a similar history in her first pregnancy but failed to attend ANC and still attempted vaginal delivery in this second pregnancy. She was counseled to ensure early ANC in next pregnancy. She is doing well.



**Abigail JOSHUA**, a 24-year-old lady in her first pregnancy. She presented with features of prolonged labour and inability to feel fetal movement. She was diagnosed of obstructed labour and intrauterine fetal death. A dead fetus was extracted via C-section. She is doing well.



**Zulihat YUNUSA**, a 23-year-old in her second pregnancy though no child. Not registered for formal Antenatal Care. She presented with features of obstructed labour and fetal distress. Had a severely asphyxiated female neonate via emergency C-Section. Baby couldn't make it but Mother is doing well.



**Hulera KASMI**, 37-year-old mother of 4 children who presented in her 10<sup>th</sup> pregnancy at term with excessive vaginal bleeding and inability to feel fetal movement. She was diagnosed of Antepartum Haemorrhage and IUFD (Intra Uterine Fetal Death) due to Placenta previa. An emergency C-Section was done during which a dead male baby was extracted and a major placenta previa was confirmed. She did well and was well counseled on discharge.

➤ Recall that **Daniel Samuel** was the last baby of the month? Unfortunately, he came in with an umbilical infection. Our Medical officer was consulted and he placed him on series of antibiotics. Glory be to God, his condition has now improved.



Some of our children had respiratory infections characterized with severe cough and vomiting, shortness of breath and fever. Morgan Samuel came to the clinic having symptoms of malaria and now feeling better after treatments. Some of the children with skin problems have continued to improve.









#### THE GOSPEL

The gospel continues to be shared among our patients and their caregivers through various avenues - Morning devotion sessions and ward evangelism. Our morning devotion sessions are attended by both Christians and non-Christians, with good attendance.
